This document is the deliverable of the Task 1.3 of the Virtual Mobility Grant SOME-SEMANTIC ONTOLOGY MODEL founded by the COST Action: CA19136 with Reference number: E-COST-GRANT-CA19136-d93c2bbe

The reference task is related to Knowledge Graph implementation of the SHAFE core ontology using NoSQL technology.

After some meetings with the Net4Age WG5 Leader, the glossary proposed in the deliverable 1 has been expanded. The new glossary is reported in table 1.

The glossary has only nouns because it is the natural lexical category used to represent concepts by humans (Rinaldi, 2014).

The ontological conceptual representation (Gruber, 1995) has been implemented as a logical knowledge graph (Fensel et al, 2020) using a physical multimodel NoSQL DBMS (Liu, 2018).

In the field of database design, a multi-model database is a database management system designed to support multiple data models. In contrast, most database management systems are organized around a single data model that determines how

data can be organized, stored, and manipulated. Document, graph, relational, and key-value models are examples of data models that may be supported by a multi-model database.

I have used this kind of NOSQL technology because the knowledge graph could be expanded with several new concepts and these concepts could be represented not only by textual information but also with multimedia ones.

The chosen DMBS has been Arango (ArangoDB, 2022).

ArangoDB is a free and open-source native graph database system developed by ArangoDB Inc. ArangoDB is a multi-model database system since it supports three data models (graphs, JSON documents, key/value) with one database core and a unified query language AQL (ArangoDB Query Language). AQL is mainly a declarative language and allows the combination of different data access patterns in a single query. ArangoDB is a NoSQL database system but AQL is similar in many ways to SQL.

The choice of ArangoDB is related to its free and open source license, its native multimodel nature, the user friendly interface and query language, the several features enabled on Arango for analyse and retrieve knowledge.

The entire WordNet (i.e. the general knowledge base used in this grant see Deliverable 1) has been imported in Arango Figure 1 shows the Arango management interface on the WordNet instance.



Figure 1: Arango management interface for WordNet

Starting from WordNet a subgraph has been extracted considering the terms in the glossary. These terms have been linked by the WordNet linguistic properties mapped by the model proposed in deliverable 2.

The subgraph has been recognized using a shortest path measure between the root WordNet synset (i.e. "entity") and the glossary terms considering the WordNet properties. We explicit point out that all terms are connected because WordNet has this common root.

I reported all concepts added in the subgraph to create the paths among glossary terms in Table 2.




Figure 2: The Knowledge Graph
